Our CRO Trojahn gave the crime stats for the last month. Overall, crimes were down 34%, but there were some license plate thefts and a package stolen from a front porch. He also reported that Coleman Place School needs school crossing guards and that license plate guards are available at some auto stores.

Guest speaker was Bob Batcher of the Prime Plus Center on Newport Ave. He invited seniors to attend the center for a wide range of classes and "a place to connect."

Treasurer Theresa Russell gave the report of income and expenses for the month, noting a balance of \$6,636.78 as of Nov. 20, 2018.

Old business -- Carolyn Foca reported that the Fall Bazaar's baked goods sale netted \$103. Carolyn and Diane Lionetti reported they attended the Trunk or Treat at Janaf to hand out Halloween candy to trick or treaters. Lisa Martin contacted current league officers to confirm whether they will remain for a new term. Bill Jackson reported that about 30 of the flags put out for Veterans Day were taken.

Susan Tweed won the 50/50 raffle and donated the money back to the civic league. Meeting adjourned at 8:20 p.m.

Estabrook/Coleman Place Civic League General Meeting – Dec. 18, 2018

President Susan Tweed opened the meeting at 7 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance, led by Bill Jackson, and the Lord's Prayer, led by Fred Gallup. Members have been trained and certified by the Department of Behavioral Health to assist others in recovery and wellness, as well as self-help programs and emerging best practice education. Through peer-led non-clinical services, peers will help participants learn and

practice recovery skills, as well as to exercise choice and decision-making responsibility in a safe, friendly and supportive environment.



GREEN NOTE by Jeanine Lindberg

Plastic retail bags are very convenient and look so harmless. In reality, they can turn into unsightly litter and, more importantly, do great harm to some of nature's creatures. When the bags are swept into storm sewers (which empty unfiltered into local water ways) or are discarded on beaches, they can end up in the ocean. There, once inflated with water and carried along by the ocean's currents the bags resemble jellyfish, a favorite snack for critically endangered oceanic leatherback turtles. Once swallowed, the bags get stuck in the turtle's throat and cause it to die from starvation. (Huff Post Green) Please dispose of plastic bags properly at a retailer that accepts used plastic bags. Norfolk's curbside recycling program *does not* take that type of film plastic. Better yet, if you haven't already, switch over to reusable bags!
